### I. Opening Prayer

### II. Diocesan Gathering: thoughts? Can we send a follow up email to participants with healthcare and education and synodality questions?

- General take away: It was great to see people in person – sacramental experience in being with each other – photos a huge benefit.
- Need to follow up with the participants and send out: an evaluation form, table talk questions, slides and talking point for Haiti Healthcare Presentation and Education.
- Need to follow up in ways that provide continued dialogue to build on what has been shared. Questions posed by one of the attendees as being most relevant: "How do we practice synodality and/or listen better to/with our twins?" or "How do we be present to our twins in the current climate where we cannot travel?" or "How do we practice sustainability, when our twins are experiencing crisis conditions?"
- Healthcare in Haiti was presented with a more global lens – with a desire to benefit more people with a more stable structure

### III. Haiti Healthcare Update. Fr. Herald's talk was very well received. Is there a possibility of HEST and HHCT working together on a medical/school outreach? the school health initiatives (both health education and health care in schools) and the education of clinicians seem like good fits for collaboration between the two teams

- This is a good question to ask a larger audience to include HEST
- Healthcare in Haiti was presented with a more global lens – with a desire to benefit more people with a more stable structure – Education without healthcare is at a disadvantage
- The Diocese of Hinche is paying attention to this and it is one of their priorities

- Diane suggested a letter go along with the sending as a way to provide a summary of what has been happening.

- HPST (Haiti Partnership Support Team) – Just now forming. Patricia Britz and Patricia Hawn both said yes to being a part of this group. William Slowinski will be the representative from the Commission. Sometime in March will be a starting meeting. Still looking for members. It was suggested to reach out to St. Edward.
- HEST (Haiti Education Support Team) – Finalizing Ask Campaign
- HHST (Haiti Healthcare Support Team) – Focusing on more global approach to Healthcare. HHST would like to work more collaboratively with HEST and get a better picture of what is already happening in Hinche that HHST can plug into.
